Headteacher's Update

Admissions Consultation for 2022

On Tuesday 17th November, the consultation to lower the published admission numbers for Reception for September 2022 from 45 to 30 was opened and will close on the 9th January. The link to the survey is on the website and below:

The reason for the consultation is due to the decline in forecasted births in the local area.

Nursery Consultation Feedback

In January 2020, the school completed a consultation to lowering the age on entry from 4 to 2 years. The vision is to open a nursery class for children aged 3-4 years and longer term, a class for children aged 2-3 years. 







Oak Class have been working hard learning to add and subtract mixed numbers. It's been quite tricky but we've all tried so hard and have done so well!
